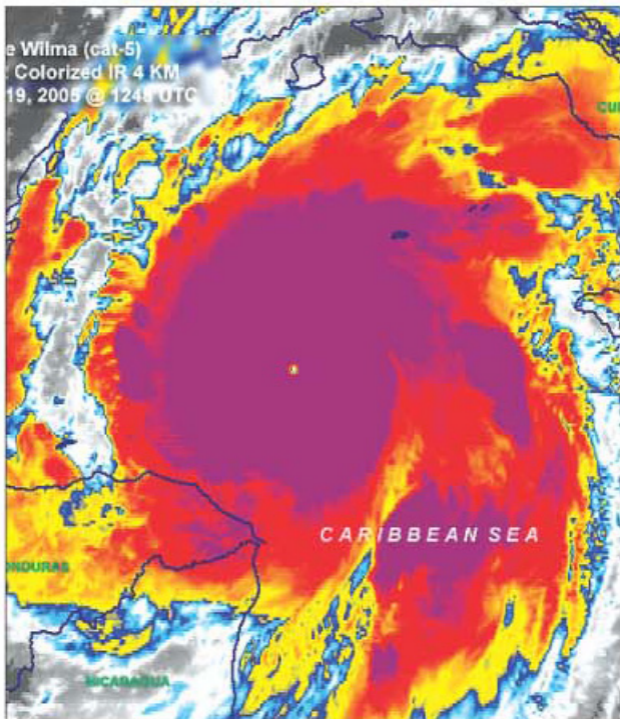


WILMA'S CHANGING EYE

Oct. 19: Tight, terrifying eye

Wilma sets record as strongest hurricane ever recorded, with an all-time low pressure of 882 millibars. It has 175 mph winds. Wilma will strike the Yucatan as a Category 4 and pound it for two days, then move off as a Category 2 storm and pick up forward motion to 23 mph as it aims at southwest Florida.



Oct. 24: Eye is 65 miles wide

Wilma comes ashore south of Naples. Hurricane force winds extend to past Lake Okeechobee at this point. Wind field covers most of peninsula and stretches well out into Atlantic Ocean. Wilma moved northeast swiftly, and by 9:45 a.m., the wide eye covered all of Palm Beach County.
