with the June 1987 expectations for the same period indicate that changes in economic conditions had reduced expectations for state revenue collections approximately \$6.2 billion in 1988-89. The erosion of revenue during the four-year fiscal period 1986-1989 was on

the order of \$9.6 billion.

The Second Called Session, Seventieth Legislature

The 1987 Second Called Session adopted a balanced budget for the 1988-89 biennium. A vital element in the budget so-

lution was \$5.7 billion in new taxes which increased the amount available for general revenue spending in 1988-89 by 25 percent. The omnibus tax bill (House Bill 61) increased the state sales tax to 6 percent and expanded the sales tax base, raised the motor ve-
