Teaching Middle School students how to put on a Condom is Not Consistent with the Values of Round Rock:

According to the Round Rock Leader, Round Rock ISD board President Chad Chadwell wants to teach middle school students how to put on condoms. "I would rather risk making a few students and teachers feel uncomfortable and show them condom use and prevent some teen pregnancies...", said Chadwell during the October 11th meeting of the school board.

This view was also echoed by RRISD Trustee Catherine Hanna, who, along with Mr. Chadwell, were quoted in the Austin American Statesman today saying that "they supported showing students how to effectively use a condom."

"I'm not sure what community Mr. Chadwell lives in, but this does not reflect the values of families in our school district," said Tere McCann, who is seeking election to the RRISD board. "Do we really want to be showing our 13 year old children how to use condoms?" he said. "Certainly, we should be teaching the science of human reproduction in our schools, but teaching kids about condoms and bananas is not the way to do it. Mr. Chadwell is wrong on this issue, and he is wrong for our school board!"
